

The BSUP Slum Rehabilitation project was selected by Smithsonian's Cooper-Hewitt, National Design Museum, New York & was on display as part of the Exhibition titled "Design with the Other 90%: CITIES." at United Nations in New York in 2012. 

James, a principal at WRT, an interdisciplinary design firm in California, USA had an interaction with the faculty members at PVP CoA where the general geographies and planning systems of Pune city were discussed. He was then introduced to the working culture of the Institute and interacted with the faculty members who explained the intent of studio works, pinned up exhibits, etc. He spent some time in discussing the studio outcomes with M. Arch. Urban Design and Landscape Architecture students. He further engaged himself in understanding the way undergraduate design studios work. He later gave a talk to students and faculty members on 'Resilient Communities: Exploring Challenges and Solutions' where he discussed the practices and projects done by WRT, LLC, San Francisco. Some of the interesting projects discussed were, Microsoft Silicon Valley Campus, Meriden Commons, Paseo Verde in Philadelphia, Bothin Marsh Reserve, Brisbane Baylands Specific Plan, Lake Meritt Master Plan, Castro Valley Redevelopment Strategic Plan, Mariposa Park at San Francisco. The talk ended with a few open-ended questions posed to the audience about climate change. Ar. James Stickley shared his observations from his experience of Pune city like the urban canopy of Pune is its identity and it needs to be conserved along with the hills, streams and other green cover. He strongly expressed this as the image of Pune city! He also commented that as architects and designers we need to be committed to bringing in a resilient and sustainable approach in our projects. He was impressed by the students' work at PVP CoA and mentioned that he found the work to be very thoughtful and of a good quality.

Session Details :

They presented a lecture on 'Urban Stories of India: Yesterday and Today'. Later through his presentation, Prof. Manoj discussed the need to study Indian urban areas, excluding the Metros like Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, and Chennai. They pressed on a need to study urbanism in South Asian cities with focus on the 2nd tier cities. They argued we cannot follow the ideas of urbanism from the Global North and expect them to fit in the Global South. A new discourse on urban studies has to be developed, and urban planning paradigms that transform urban India have to be researched. This was further discussed by highlighting the case of the midsize historic towns of India. The session concluded with a call by Prof. Parmar for further research and collaboration with PVP COA and its students.
